Fast Facts

Empowering midwives from Canada and around the world with the leadership, scholarship, and clinical knowledge needed to advance their contributions as a midwife, drive positive change and strengthen the midwifery profession.

- Launched in 2022 as Canada's first graduate degree in midwifery
 - Our first graduates completed the program in Winter 2024
 - Our fourth cohort of students will start May 2025
- Delivered primarily asynchronously and online
 - Only required in-person components are two residency weeks (in first year, and final year)
 - Residency week occurs the first full week of June (June 2 6, 2025)
- Two program streams available:
 - Course plus Capstone stream (2 years full-time, or 3 years part-time)
 - Thesis stream (2 years full-time)
- May program start (May 5, 2025)

Our Students

Program Learning Outcomes

- Apply theoretical knowledge to **plan**, **implement**, **and lead change** within health care settings to transform systems and achieve results,
- Apply concepts of social justice as a leader and to promote equitable sexual and reproductive health care that meets community needs,
- **Advocate for and lead expansion** of the role and contributions of midwives in health systems,
- Communicate effectively as a leader using both written and oral communication strategies,
- Apply knowledge to evaluate initiatives in a health care setting or conduct original research to advance scholarship within the field of midwifery, and
- Demonstrate critical analysis and expertise in a focus area of midwifery leadership (e.g., advanced practice, professional leadership, midwifery education, midwifery research).

Program Eligibility

Clinical Experience

2 years of full-time clinical experience as a practising midwife*

OR

An equivalent amount of part-time experience (~ 1900 hours)*



Education/Training Experience

A four-year honours undergraduate degree in midwifery (or its international equivalent)

OR

Qualified for registration as a midwife in a Canadian jurisdiction

OR

A four-year honours undergraduate degree (or its international equivalent) **AND** the additional training, diplomas/degrees, licensing, etc. that are required to be a Midwife within their local jurisdiction

Includes:

- Graduates of a Canadian Midwifery Education
 Program
- Internationally-trained midwives with a degree in midwifery equivalent to a Canadian four-year (honours) bachelor degree

Includes:

- Indigenous Midwives trained through a community-based Indigenous Midwifery Program
- Canadian pre-legislation midwives
- Internationally-trained midwives who completed a Canadian bridging program and are Registered Midwives in a Canadian jurisdiction

Includes Internationally-trained Midwives with:

- A diploma in midwifery and a degree equivalent to a Canadian four-year (honours) bachelor degree
- A degree equivalent to a Canadian four-year (honours) bachelor degree and post-graduate credentials in midwifery



Application Requirements


- A statement of interest

- A resume/curriculum vitae (CV)
- Contact information for three references
- Answers to a few program-specific questions within the online application system
- Information on English language proficiency
- A sample of their academic writing (thesis-stream applicants only)
